The 4th November 2017 is a very big and busy day on the Cooma Rotary calendar with both the National Busking Festival and Motorfest.



Allen advised the Busking Festival is going from strength to strength and now has stated aims to enable moving forward into the future.

These aims are:

- To enrich communities culturally and economically around Australia by staging regional busking competitions.
- To provide a stage for community based music groups and individual performing artists of all ages and all music genres to present street performance to larger public audiences.
- To encourage, mentor, promote and develop career pathways for emerging musicians and performing artists.
- To establish an annual music and busking festival in Cooma NSW that is of national significance.

Cooma Rotary and the ANBC are a strong local partnership who are developing a major local event.

There is a busking sub-committee consisting of David B, Graham F, Marco R, Neil b and John C.

As Motorfest is on the same day it is going to take a major effort from all Rotarians, Interactors and other volunteers to make the day a success.

At Motorfest catering will be covered by Rotary and the Loins feeding upwards of 1000 people. Shifts will start from 7.30am with at least 6 people per shift.

The Coffee Van will be in the park.

Volunteer's Rosters for both events will be provided in October to ensure everyone will be ready for the day.
