There talks from the founder of R U OK, a young lady who was involved in a car accident who spoke about consequences and the final talk was from a vision-impaired lady who shared the difficulties of living life without sight. She also showed some of the aids a visually impaired person uses. The experience was very different to their everyday life. It was an opportunity to meet new people and experience different activities.

### Guest Speaker - Sacha

Eleven months ago on 21 July 2018, Sacha introduced herself to the Cooma Rotary Club. She had arrived at Canberra airport where she was greeted by her first host family. She didn't realise she was about to embark on her greatest and scariest adventure in her life to date. They got in the car and started the drive back to Cooma, where she realised that this was for real.

Those first days in her new home were horrible, she thought that she would not be able to cope with being away from her family for so long, she thought she wasn't strong enough. Now at the end she realises she was stronger than she thought.



On her third day in Cooma, her host mum took her up to Nanny Goat Hill to see the vista of the town where she would be living for the next twelve months and she was enthralled. The first town outside she visited outside of Cooma was Nimmitabel and decided the name and the town was so cool that she was going to name her first born after it.



There were her first encounters with baby kangaroos and wombats, with whom she fell instantly in love with as they were so cute. Then there was the first experience of a major event without her family, five days after arriving she turned 17, but new friends and family made the day special.

The first day of school was terrifying, she thought that nobody would want to be her friend and it would be so hard to break into already established friendship groups. Over the year, she has made five very close friends and a large number of other friends.

She has realised how different she now is from that person on that day. She is stronger and more confident. She has learnt to be open to the world and to be open to all experiences as you never know what you will gain from them.

A month after arriving, there was the first meeting with the other exchange students in the district. Once again, the fears kicked in but after meeting them, those fears abated. There was the realisation that these people were sharing a unique experience with her and they would be all in this big adventure together.

One of the things Sacha really liked about being an exchange student was the many friends and memories you make together.

The saddest part of exchange for her was Christmas, not being in the cold with snow or her family but it was also a happy time as she got to experience a different type of Christmas and her host family made her feel very welcome. She also had to get used to missing major family events like birthdays but this was all part of the journey.

There were many different experiences like bush walking, learning to ride a horse, learning to surf, trekking up Mount Kosciusko. Going to Sydney, visiting Bondi Beach, and going to Melbourne. The travel highlight was going on Safari and seeing Adelaide, Alice Springs, Uluru and the beaches of Queensland.

She finds it hard to believe her time in Cooma has gone by so quickly. She extended many thanks to her new friends, her host families and to the members of the Cooma Rotary Club for making her feel very welcome and part of the Cooma community.
