Rotary tour of the historic Brigidine Convent-St Pats building, Wednesday the 21st October, meet at 5.30 PM by the historic steps from Vale Street and the imposing front doors of the old convent

This is a rare opportunity to see behind the scenes of one of the most imposing and important buildings in the religious, educational and social history of Cooma and

the Monaro. We also have the great privilege of being guided by Hass who not only worked at St Pats for 39 years [more than two life sentences] plus 8 years as a relief teacher. For the past 30 years Hass organized ex-student reunions. Kevin will also provide assistance, he joined the staff in 1981 as the first assistant principal and in the late 80s became the principal.

Guest Speaker – Peter Bascomb



At the meeting this week Peter spoke about the vision for the Snowy Monaro region. He started with a bit of Local Government 101, then shared the Council's vision and the stages of the Organisational redesign and the leadership restructure and the key themes and deliverables for the 2021 financial year.

The Council consists of elected councillors who provide the policy framework, set strategies, monitor performance and consider the allocating of

resources. A councillor cannot direct council staff to undertake any tasks, that is the job of the General Manager. The General Manager and the council staff implement the strategy and policy, ensure compliance, provide advice to council on strategies and report to council on activities and outcomes.

One of the visions of the Council is to become a trusted community partner. Work is currently being undertaken to achieve this. The organisation is also undergoing a redesign the first stage is the restructuring of the leadership team. The second stage is to introduce Australian Business Excellence Framework, the third stage is the consolidation of policy, ensuring there is an evidenced based decision-making system, undertake service reviews to see what is being provided and if it is being done in the best possible way, and finally ensuring long term financial viability of the council. Stage 4 is to do this all again and ensure we are getting better in performing as a council.

The leadership restructure sees the term General Manager changed to Chief Executive Officer who oversees five senior staff who have responsibility for six different areas. This will allow for the council to be better situated to work towards the goal of long-term financial viability. Part of this restructure includes the role of the Chief Communications Officer. A function of this role is to ensure better communication with the residents of the region so make sure there are no surprises for resident in the future.

Key deliverables for the 2021 Financial year include:

- Review Development Assessment and Building Certification customer service
 provision
- Upgrade bike path surface, install 5 additional seats and install 84 solar lights along Cooma Creek
- Bobeyan Road: sealing over three years
- Water meter replacement program
- Reviewing strategic waste options for region
- Detailed design Snowy Monaro Regional Council civic centre

Peter's personal goal for the evening was to have everyone attending to download Snap, Send, Solve app which allows the easy reporting of community issues.
