Guest Speaker – Steve Cuff

Steve is the Owner/Editor of the Snowy Post Magazine based in Jindabyne. Which is a free magazine which promotes the Snowy Mountains area to tourists. They are



currently in their fifth year of publication. He started life as a snow photographer in the 1990's, worked for Perisher, Thredbo and Hotham. He also worked for the Snowy Times.

This recent edition has information on the Jindabyne Special Activation Precinct (SAP). The consultation period has been undertaken and the draft Master Plan is currently in Sydney awaiting funding approval. If funded it has the

potential to inject several hundred million dollars into the Jindabyne and the National Park area. It is expected some of the funding will go into infrastructure, sewerage, water and major developments around town.

The SAP is being put into place to support any developers who might want to create a project. The work being done now will mean that these developments, such as a golf course or mountain bike paths, will be able to go ahead without all the red tape of gaining planning approvals etc as the approvals will already be in place. It is intended that the SAP will generate projects which in turn will increase tourism to the area.

The general consensus from the Community is they want development but not along the lines of high-rise apartments around the lakeshore. There will also be some new buildings, more parking and alternative transport options in the National Park to cater to more visitors. It should be noted that the SAP is not intended to build any new resorts in the National Park.

As many things are still under discussion, there will be two more reports which the public will be able to make comment on before anything is completed.
